WHEN DATA IS COLLECTED: 3. 11. – 12. 11. 2018

RESEARCH ORGANIZATION:

The research was conducted by the CVVM research team of the Institute of Sociology of the CAS, v.v.i., as part of the research “Our Society 2018”. The data were collected by the CVVM interviewer network.

Research parameters:

1104 persons representing the population of the Czech Republic older than 15 years were asked. Quotas used for respondent’s selection were gender, age and education. The territorial representativeness of the sample is maintained by the construction of the interviewer network, where the checked characters are the size of the place of residence and regions (former regions). Population parameters correspond to the structure of the population of the Czech Republic broken down by socio-demographic characteristics (sex, education, age) and by territory. Overall, we can say that the sample of respondents is representative because its composition corresponds to the basic population (with a tolerance of minimal deviations).

The field data collection was attended by a total of 239 interviewers who rated the interviewing situation very well on average. Due to the good quality of the completed questionnaires, all interviews were included in the processing.

The sample shows a good level of representativity and has not been weighted.

Method of data collection:

Standardized interview. The data were collected by trained interviewers of the CVVM interviewing network.
