Two surveys conducted on the panel of respondents, before the first and the second round of elections to the Senate of the Czech Parliament in 1996

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A. TECHNICAL INFORMATION

Country: Czech Republic.

Fieldwork Date:

Survey 1 - from November 15 to November 16, 1996

Survey 2 - from November 22 to November 23, 1996

Investigator:

SC&C (Prague) for Czech Television.

Context of the Survey:

Merged data file results from two surveys conducted on the panel of respondents. First survey was fielded during the period of 48 hours before the first round of election for the Senate of the Parliament of the Czech Republic in 1996, second survey was conducted during the period of 24 hours before the second round. The results were aired on Czech television as a part of electoral news.

Both surveys were organized by SC&C. The fieldwork was carried out by Aktuel (Prague) under supervision of SC&C.

After the election the research continued in third survey of the same panel of respondents. Its data are not included in the file.

General Population: Adult population (over 18) in the Czech Republic.

Sampling Procedure:

- 1) Probability stratified sample on the base of regional and political segmentation prepared by SC&C.
- 2) Cluster sampling of localities.
- 3) Selection of individuals - random walk with quote ending (sex, age, education).
- 4) Selected sample was used in both surveys.

N = 1174

Response rate information is not provided because of the sampling method used.

Fieldwork Method:

Standardized interview.

Weighting:

The data should be weighted. Weighting variable **VAHA1** was constructed on the bases of the official results and participation in elections.

Elections to the Parliament of the Czech Republic in 1996:

The elections in 1996 were the first regular parliamentary elections in the newly established Czech Republic. After the split of the Czechoslovak Federation into the Czech Republic and the Slovak Republic in 1993 the Czech National Council became the Lower House of the Parliament of the Czech Republic - the Chamber of Deputies.

There were two elections in the Czech Republic in 1996. The new electoral system to the Parliament of the Czech Republic was adopted in 1995. On the base of its amendments was held elections to the Chamber of Deputies (the lower house of the Parliament) as well as new elections to the Senate (the upper house).

The elections for the Chamber of Deputies were held from Friday, 31 May to Saturday, 1 June. The electoral system is based on the principle of proportional representation. The chamber has 200 Deputies who shall be elected for a term of four years.

The Senate shall have 81 members, which are elected by direct franchise according to the principles of the majority system. There were established 81 single-mandate election districts for the election of senators so, that each of them includes the territory having approximately the same amount of population. There is one senator being elected for the period of 6 years in each of these districts.

Pursuant to the Constitution of the Czech Republic in this first election to the Senate there are senators elected in all 81 election districts, with the exception of one third of them being elected only for two years, one third of them for four years and the last third of them for six years. From this scheme arises, that within the next years the election to the Senate shall be held every two years always in 27 election districts, while the term of post of so elected senators shall be always six years.

The first elections to the Senate (two rounds) were held in November 1996.

First round: from November 15 to November 16, 1996.

Second round: from November 22 to November 23, 1996.
