INFORMATION ON THE SURVEY**Focus of the survey:**

The survey was conducted as a part of the System Change and Modernization project (France, the Czech Republic, Poland, Slovakia) which was focused on exploration of the dynamic of the change of the system and of modernization in the course of so called "transition" after the collapse of communist regimes at East to the recent period. The main objective of the survey is to bring an empirical evidence on the dynamic of change at the macro level on the basis of a comparison between Poland, the Czech Republic, and Slovakia.

The data allow to identify:

1. the most influential social and institutional actors, their interests and strategies, participation in relation to the processes of transformation and modernization
2. perception of national authorities, political and economical strategies of transformation and modernization, and social policies offered to different groups affected by these strategies.

The Slovak survey was prepared by the Research team on transformation and modernization, Institute of Sociology, Academy of Sciences of the Czech Republic, Prague, in cooperation with J. Banczak (Institute of Sociology, Slovak Academy of Sciences). The fieldwork was carried out by STEM - Center for Empirical Studies.

General Population:

Population of Slovakia 20 - 59 years of age.

Sampling Procedure:

Random stratified sample, random walk.

Fieldwork Methods:

Standardized face-to-face interview. Trained interviewers of STEM and STEM/MARK. Before the interviewer's visit, all respondents (or their households) were notified by a letter asking for their cooperation.
