Instructions for Enumerators

In the beginning of the interview, explain to the questioned person:

1. he(she) has been chosen along with 4.000 other people to participate in the study which is being conducted by the Federal Statistical Bureau together with CSAV (Czechoslovak Academy of Science, Bureau of Philosophy and Sociology). The information they provide is anonymous. The answers will not be provided to any organizations or persons, and they will be processed only together within the whole file.

Instructions to fill out questionnaire.

The questionnaire should be filled out by the enumerator together with the respondent who is allowed to see the questionnaire. The questions should be asked in the order which they appear. In the questions where it is specifically said to give the respondent a card with alternative answers, the enumerator ought to do so. Unless otherwise instructed, the enumerator marks the answers as follows:

- 1. In case of a question with alternative answers marked with numbers at the right hand side, the questioning person should circle the number of the chosen answer.
- 2. If the question covers more parts marked with letters a/, b/, c/,..., the questioning person should circle the numbers in each of them separately.
- 3. In case the alternative answers are included only in the card or headline of tab, the questioning person should fill out the relevant number into empty square or he(she) should circle it in the tab.
- 4. Where it is not mentioned "coded by district department" or "do not code", the questioning person should leave the squares empty.
- 5. If a question is about a year, the questioning person should mark the last two numbers of relevant year in the empty squares. Other numerical data should be filled into the squares in the whole form (salary of the person, size of the household) so that data is shorter than the number of squares the left side squares, should be left empty.
- 6. The answers which the questioning person does not code directly should be filled out into the pointed lines. The numerator is supposed to use a pen compete the questionnaire.
